NSW LAND REGISTRY SERVICES

On 29 June 2020, the NSW Land Registry Services relocated its Lodgement and Title Search office from Queens Square, Sydney to Level 30, 175 Liverpool Street, Sydney.

The new location is at the southern end of Hyde Park, opposite the ANZAC Memorial and close to Museum Train Station.

If you are seeking to obtain copies of documents associated with land records can attend their offices in person where copies can be obtained for approximately \$15 each. An alternative option is to engage an Information Broker and order copies of documents online. A list of Information Brokers can be located on the NSW Land Registry Services Website.

DIOCESE OF NEWCASTLE

The University of Newcastle Library is digitising the registers of Anglican churches in the Diocese of Newcastle, NSW.

CORNISH BORN SOUTH AUSTRALIANS

GenealogySA has already assembled very comprehensive databases of both the early Irish and early German settlers, each with well over 20,000 entries. Now, with the Cornish-born South Australians (CBSA) project, the aim is to construct an equally large and comprehensive database of people who were born in Cornwall (before 1900) and emigrated from their birth country to South Australia.

Genealogy SA already has some small data sets of limited scope which will be augmented by the results of this widespread, ongoing CBSA survey. It is expected the database will be of invaluable use to family historians. Forms for compiling this information, along with "How to" samples of the forms and guides are now available for download from their website.
